The only reference I have found to War Office combined maps is in the Ordnance Survey Annual Report for 1884, under "War Office" where it states - "A combined map of Hertford on 6-inch and 1/2500 scales was made, and 69 copies supplied."

The combined map conveniently shows War Office property or "estate" at two or three different scale on one sheet, but the production of a combined map seems a large effort for such a small requirement.

Commonly, though not always, these maps combine on one sheet extracts from 1:63,360, 1:10,560 and 1:2,500 scale maps all covering the same location and were presumably produced for the Inspector General of Fortifications or some other War Office department.

Only a few such combined Maps have been found in the National Archives, Kew.

Has anyone found other examples?
